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10	An Act relating to alcoholic beverage licenses; creating a complimentary beverage license for certain				
11	purpose; stating eligibility for license; restricting purchases to certain providers; exempting employees				
12	who serve beverages from licensure; making license renewable annually; exempting license from permanent				
13	location requirement; allowing winery and brewer to serve samples and sealed product on certain premises;				
14	amending Section 13, Chapter 366, O.S.L. 2016, as last amended by Section 2, Chapter 312, O.S.L. 2018				
15	(37A O.S. Supp. 2018, Section 2-101), which relates to license fees; setting license fees; providing for				
16	codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.				
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19	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:				
20	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified				
21	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2-159 of Title 37A, unless there				
22	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:				
23	A complimentary beverage license shall authorize the holder				
24	thereof: To provide, free of charge for on premises consumption				

1 only, no more than two alcoholic beverages containing spirits, 2 twelve (12) ounces of wine, or twenty-four (24) ounces of beer per 3 day, to a quest or client who is twenty-one (21) years of age or This license shall not be issued to a business which 4 older. 5 possesses any other form of license issued by the ABLE Commission, 6 except for event-type licenses. Complimentary beverage licenses 7 shall only be issued to a business located in a building or structure that has a permanent physical address. This license shall 8 9 only be issued to businesses which involve retail sales or provide 10 services to its clients including, but not limited to, furniture 11 stores, art studios, nail salons, hair salons, cigar stores, 12 clothing stores, bridal shops or business support services. A 13 chamber of commerce, main street, economic development authority, vocational trade school, higher education college or similar 14 15 organization promoting economic development or an organization that 16 is exempt from taxation pursuant to the provisions of subsection (c) 17 of Section 501 of the United States Internal Revenue Code shall also qualify for a complimentary beverage license. A business whose 18 patronage is primarily persons under the age of eighteen (18), is a 19 restaurant or a business that provides adult entertainment shall not 20 qualify for a license. Upon issuance of the license, the business 21 shall purchase all of its alcoholic beverages from a brewer, 22 winemaker, retail spirit, retail beer, or retail wine licensee and 23 will become a licensed premise subject to inspection by any ABLE 24

Commission agent or any other peace officer, pursuant to Section 5-1 115 of Title 37A of the Oklahoma Statutes. Employees who serve the 2 3 alcoholic beverage shall be twenty-one (21) years of age or older and shall not be required to obtain an employee license. 4 Α 5 complimentary beverage license shall not be used in lieu of a mixed beverage, caterer, brew pub, brewer, public event, special event, 6 beer and wine, or charitable event license. This license is an 7 annual license and renewable on an annual basis. 8

9 A chamber of commerce, main street, economic development 10 authority, vocational trade school, higher education college or 11 similar organization promoting economic development shall be exempt 12 from the permanent location requirement and permitted to utilize the 13 license at other locations within the city in which they are located 14 or on their campus for member recruitment, education and development 15 of new business functions.

16 The holder of an Oklahoma winery or brewers license may serve 17 free samples and offer for sale sealed product for off premises 18 consumption at temporary tastings on the premises of a complimentary 19 beverage licensee.

20 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY Section 13, Chapter 366, O.S.L. 21 2016, as last amended by Section 2, Chapter 312, O.S.L. 2018 (37A 22 O.S. Supp. 2018, Section 2-101), is amended to read as follows:

22	a Mixed	Beverage License an administrative fee, which shall not be
23	deemed t	o be a license fee, in the amount of Five Hundred Dollars
24	(\$500.00	), which shall be paid at the same time and in the same

1 manner as the license fees prescribed by paragraph 10 of subsection 2 A of this section; provided, this fee shall not be assessed against 3 service organizations or fraternal beneficiary societies which are 4 exempt under Section 501(c)(19), (8) or (10) of the Internal Revenue 5 Code.

2. There shall be added to the fee for a Mixed Beverage/Caterer
Combination License an administrative fee, which shall not be deemed
to be a license fee, in the amount of Two Hundred Fifty Dollars
(\$250.00), which shall be paid at the same time and in the same
manner as the license fee prescribed by paragraph 11 of subsection A
of this section.

12 C. Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection A of this 13 section:

The license fee for a mixed beverage or bottle club license
 for those service organizations or fraternal beneficiary societies
 which are exempt under Section 501(c)(19), (8) or (10) of the
 Internal Revenue Code shall be Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) per
 year; and

The renewal fee for an airline/railroad beverage license
 held by a railroad described in 49 U.S.C., Section 24301, shall be
 One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00).

D. An applicant may apply for and receive both an on-premisesbeer and wine license and a caterer license.

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E. All licenses, except as otherwise provided, shall be valid
 for one (1) year from date of issuance unless revoked or
 surrendered. Provided, all employee licenses shall be valid for two
 (2) years.

5 F. The holder of a license, issued by the ABLE Commission, for a bottle club located in a county of this state where the sale of 6 7 alcoholic beverages by the individual drink for on-premises consumption has been authorized, may exchange the bottle club 8 9 license for a mixed beverage license or an on-premises beer and wine 10 license and operate the licensed premises as a mixed beverage establishment or an on-premises beer and wine establishment subject 11 12 to the provisions of the Oklahoma Alcoholic Beverage Control Act. There shall be no additional fee for such exchange and the mixed 13 beverage license or on-premises beer and wine license issued shall 14 15 expire one (1) year from the date of issuance of the original bottle club license. 16

In addition to the applicable licensing fee, the following 17 G. surcharge shall be assessed annually on the following licenses: 18 Nonresident Seller or Manufacturer License..... \$2,500.00 19 1. 20 2. Wine and Spirits Wholesaler License...... \$2,500.00 3. 21 Retail Spirits License for cities and towns 22 4. 23 over 5,000 population..... \$250.00

20	H. Any license issued by the ABLE Commission under this title
21	may be relied upon by other licensees as a valid license, and no
22	other licensee shall have any obligation to independently determine
23	the validity of such license or be held liable solely as a
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consequence of another licensee's failure to maintain a valid
 license.

3	SECTION 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 2019.
4	SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
5	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
6	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
7	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
