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8	An Act relating to voter registration; amending 26 O.S. 2011, Section 4-120, which relates to
9	cancellation of registrations; modifying requirements for cancellation of voter registrations; requiring
10	certain notice; establishing time limitation to present certain evidence; updating statutory
11	reference; authorizing state membership in multistate
12	voter list maintenance organizations; authorizing expenditure of funds for certain dues and fees;
13	allowing certain data to be provided to certain organizations; requiring secure transmission of
14	certain data; authorizing certain voter registration notification procedures; providing for codification;
15	providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.
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18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
19	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 26 O.S. 2011, Section 4-120, is
20	amended to read as follows:
21	Section 4-120. The registration of any registered voter may
22	shall be cancelled only for one any of the following reasons:
23	<u>1.</u> Written notice from the voter; death
24	2. Death of the voter; conviction

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1	3. Conviction of or plea of guilty or nolo contendere to a
2	felony offense by the voter; judicial
3	4. Judicial determination of mental incapacitation of the voter
4	under Title 30 of the Oklahoma Statutes; registration
5	5. Registration by the voter in another county or state; or
6	failure
7	6. Failure by the voter to respond to a confirmation of address
8	mailing and <u>subsequent</u> failure to vote <u>or initiate a change in voter</u>
9	registration as prescribed in Section $\frac{21}{2}$ $\frac{4-120.2}{2}$ of this act title;
10	or
11	7. The voter is identified as deceased or as having moved out
12	of state by a multistate voter list maintenance organization of
13	which this state is a member pursuant to Section 2 of this act. For
14	the purposes of this paragraph, written notice shall be sent to the
15	voter at the mailing address on file at the county election board
16	prior to the cancellation of a voter registration. The voter shall
17	have thirty (30) days from the date the notice is sent to provide
18	the appropriate county election board with evidence contrary to the
19	findings of the multistate voter list maintenance organization.
20	SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
21	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 4-121 of Title 26, unless there
22	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
23	A. The Secretary of the State Election Board may join the State
24	of Oklahoma as a member in one or more multistate voter list

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1 maintenance organizations including, but not limited to, the 2 Electronic Registration Information Center (ERIC) or its successor. 3 The Secretary is authorized to expend funds as available for membership fees, dues and other expenses related to such membership. 4 5 Β. Upon membership in an organization as provided in subsection 6 A of this section, the Secretary of the State Election Board may 7 provide voter registration data to the organization and the Department of Public Safety may provide motor vehicle license data 8 9 to the organization if such data is required to be provided as a 10 condition of membership. The voter registration data and motor 11 vehicle license data described in this subsection may include a 12 person's name, address, date of birth, driver license or state identification number, last four digits of a social security number 13 or any other data required by the organization. The transmission 14 15 and storage of such data shall be done in a secure manner.

C. If a multistate voter list maintenance organization of which 16 this state is a member identifies Oklahoma residents who are 17 citizens of the United States eligible to vote but not yet 18 registered, the Secretary of the State Election Board may notify 19 such citizens about the procedure for becoming a registered voter in 20 this state. The Secretary may delegate the contacting of such 21 citizens to the secretary of the appropriate county election board. 22 D. If a multistate voter list maintenance organization of which 23 this state is a member identifies a registered voter who has changed 24

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1	his or her address of residence within the state, the Secretary of
2	the State Election Board may contact such voter and advise him or
3	her of the requirement to be registered at the address of residence
4	of the voter. The voter shall be provided such information as may
5	be necessary for the voter to change his or her voter registration
6	to a new address of residence. The Secretary may delegate the
7	contacting of such citizens to the secretary of the appropriate
8	county election board.
9	SECTION 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 2020.
10	SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
11	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
12	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
13	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
