13	Section 10-103. A. When used in the Protective Services for
14	Vulnerable Adults Act:
15	1. "Protective services" means services which are necessary to
16	aid a vulnerable adult in meeting the essential requirements for
17	mental or physical health and safety that the vulnerable adult is
18	unable to provide or obtain without assistance. The term
19	"protective services" includes but is not limited to services
20	provided to or obtained for such person in order to prevent or
21	remedy the abuse, neglect, or exploitation of such person;
22	2. "Services which are necessary to aid an individual to meet
23	essential requirements for mental or physical health and safety"
24	include, but shall not be limited to:

 - a person for whom a guardian, limited guardian, or conservator has been appointed pursuant to the
 Oklahoma Guardianship and Conservatorship Act;

"Vulnerable adult" means an individual who is an incapacitated person or who, because of physical or mental disability, including persons with Alzheimer's disease or other dementias, incapacity, or other disability, is substantially impaired in the ability to provide adequately for the care or custody of himself or herself, or is unable to manage his or her property and financial affairs effectively, or to meet essential requirements for mental or physical health or safety, or to protect

1 himself or herself from abuse, verbal abuse, neglect, or exploitation without assistance from others; 2 3 6. "Caretaker" means a person who has: the responsibility for the care of a vulnerable adult 4 5 or the financial management of the resources of a vulnerable adult as a result of a family relationship, 6 7 b. assumed the responsibility for the care of a vulnerable adult voluntarily, by contract, or as a 8 9 result of the ties of friendship, or C. been appointed a quardian, limited guardian, or 10 conservator pursuant to the Oklahoma Guardianship and 11 12 Conservatorship Act; 7. - 10. "Financial neglect" means repeated instances by a caretaker, or other person, who has assumed the role of financial management, of failure to use the resources available to restore or maintain the health and physical well-being of a vulnerable adult, including, but not limited to:
 - a. squandering or negligently mismanaging the money, property, or accounts of a vulnerable adult,
 - b. refusing to pay for necessities or utilities in a timely manner, or
 - c. providing substandard care to a vulnerable adult despite the availability of adequate financial resources;

11. "Neglect" means:

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- a. the failure to provide protection for a vulnerable adult who is unable to protect his or her own interest,
- b. the failure to provide a vulnerable adult with adequate shelter, nutrition, health care, or clothing, or

"Personal degradation" means a willful act or statement by a caretaker intended to shame, degrade, humiliate or otherwise harm the personal dignity of a vulnerable adult, or where the caretaker knew or reasonably should have known the act or statement would cause shame, degradation, humiliation or harm to the personal dignity of a reasonable person. Personal degradation includes the taking, transmitting, or display of an electronic image of a vulnerable adult by a caretaker, where the caretaker's actions constitute a willful act or statement intended to shame, degrade, humiliate or otherwise harm the personal dignity of the dependent adult, or where the caretaker knew or reasonably should have known the act would cause shame, degradation, humiliation or harm to the personal dignity of a reasonable person. Personal degradation does not include:

"Sexual exploitation" includes, but is not limited to, a caretaker's causing, allowing, permitting or encouraging a vulnerable adult to engage in prostitution or in the lewd, obscene, or pornographic photographing, filming or depiction of the vulnerable adult as those acts are defined by state law; and
- 16. 17. "Verbal abuse" means the use of words, sounds, or other communication including, but not limited to, gestures, actions or behaviors, by a caretaker or other person providing services to a vulnerable adult that are likely to cause a reasonable person to experience humiliation, intimidation, fear, shame or degradation.
- B. Nothing in this section shall be construed to mean a vulnerable adult is abused or neglected for the sole reason the vulnerable adult, in good faith, selects and depends upon spiritual means alone through prayer, in accordance with the practices of a recognized religious method of healing, for the treatment or cure of

1	disease or remedial care, or a caretaker or other person
2	responsible, in good faith, is furnishing such vulnerable adult
3	spiritual means alone through prayer, in accordance with the tenets
4	and practices of a recognized church or religious denomination, for
5	the treatment or cure of disease or remedial care in accordance with
6	the practices of or express consent of the vulnerable adult.
7	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2019.
