Cooperate with, and enter into agreements with, and administer programs of, and receive federal funds from, the United 4 5 States Department of Education and other federal agencies in matters relating to vocational and technical education, youth apprenticeship 6 programs, and manpower training, and be the sole state agency for 7 such purposes. Provided that, programs and funds made available 8 through the Job Training Partnership Act, or its successor programs, 9 shall be excluded; 10

Provide for the formulation and adoption of curricula, courses of study, and other instructional aids necessary for the adequate instruction of students in the technology center schools and colleges of this state. It is the intent of the Legislature that instructional models for vocational students should include higher standards of academic work with increased emphasis on communication, computation and applied science;

7 11. Accept and provide for the administration of any land, 8 money, buildings, gifts, funds, donations or other things of value 9 which may be offered or bequeathed to the schools or colleges under 10 the supervision or control of said Board;

11 12. Enter into cooperative arrangements with one or more other 12 states for the conduct and administration of programs, services and 13 activities;

5 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 6 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 14-135 of Title 70, unless there 7 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. Subject to the availability of funds, which may include but not be limited to state appropriations, grant funds, foundation funds and other funds, the State Board of Career and Technology Education shall establish a statewide aerospace training facility, the purpose of which is to provide education and training to students to prepare them for careers in the aerospace sector or to provide retraining in the aerospace sector.

B. The State Board of Career and Technology Education shallpromulgate rules which include but are not limited to:

Criteria for enrollment in the statewide aerospace training
 facility;

Curriculum requirements, minimum courses of study and
 testing requirements for the statewide aerospace training facility;

4. Tuition for courses offered by the statewide aerospacetraining facility.
