12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:									
13	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified									
14	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 15-133 of Title 47, unless there									
15	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:									
16	For the purpose of this section, "motorcycle profiling" means									
17	the discriminatory use of the fact that a person rides a motorcycle									
18	or wears motorcycle-related apparel as a factor in deciding to stop									
19	and question, take enforcement action, arrest or search a person or									
20	vehicle without a legal basis under the United States Constitution									
21	or the Oklahoma State Constitution.									
22	Every law enforcement agency in this state shall be required to:									
23	1. Adopt a written policy designed to condemn and prevent

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1	2	•	Review	and	audit	their	existing	procedures,	practices	and
2	training;									

3 3. Institute training to address the issues related to 4 motorcycle profiling; and

4. Work with a motorcycle rights organization within this
state, to help appropriately address the issue of motorcycle
profiling and shall approve of corrected policies and procedures for
law enforcement training.

⁹ The Council on Law Enforcement Education and Training shall ¹⁰ ensure that issues related to motorcycle profiling are addressed in ¹¹ basic law enforcement training and offered in regional training for ¹² in-service law enforcement officers at all levels.

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 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2020.

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
