are purchases made for the production of such merchandise;

2. Materials, supplies and services necessary for the efficient and economical operation of revenue-generating, Department-operated facilities and programs and production of merchandise for resale, are exempt from The Oklahoma Central Purchasing Act. Payment for, including those made to maintain or improve guest perception of quality and service; and

3. The services of writers, artists, photographers or others such as, designers, programmers, prepress houses, and printers, shippers of and other professionals and firms involved in the artistic and resale merchandise involved in the artistic production of "Oklahoma Today Magazine" and other products produced by the magazine shall also be exempt from The Oklahoma Central Purchasing Act. Production and mailing of revenue-generating materials such as monthly renewals and direct mail efforts which are necessary to the engoing operation of "Oklahoma Today Magazine" shall also be exempt from The Oklahoma Central Purchasing Act department publications, television shows, websites or other revenue-generating or public-facing media.

SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this resolution shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
