NEW LAW A new section of law not to be 20 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows: 21 This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Oklahoma Public 22 Safety Unification Act of 2020". 23 24

SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 9100 of Title 74, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

- A. Effective December 1, 2020, there is hereby created the Oklahoma Public Safety Agency. It shall be the mission of the Oklahoma Public Safety Agency to enforce the laws protecting the safety of the public and provide for the prevention and detection of crime. The Oklahoma Public Safety Agency shall include the following law enforcement divisions:
- 1. The Oklahoma Highway Patrol Division, to be comprised of the Oklahoma Highway Patrol previously administered by the Department of Public Safety;
- 2. The Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation Division, to be comprised of the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation;
- 3. The Oklahoma State Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control Division, to be comprised of the Oklahoma State Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control;
- 4. The Law Enforcement Education and Training Division, to be comprised of the Council on Law Enforcement Education and Training;
- 5. The State Fire Marshal Division, to be comprised of The Office of the State Fire Marshal;
- 6. The Homeland Security Division, to be comprised of the Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security;

7. The Emergency Management Division, to be comprised of the Oklahoma Department of Emergency Management; and

- 8. The ABLE Division, to be comprised of the Oklahoma ABLE Commission.
- B. The Oklahoma Public Safety Agency may include, but not be limited to the following civilian divisions:
- The Public Safety Division, to be comprised of the remainder of the Department of Public Safety;
 - 2. Finance and Budget Division;
 - 3. Human Resources Division; and
 - 4. Training Division.

- C. The Director of the Oklahoma Public Safety Agency, created in Section 3 of this act, shall be the chief administrator of the Oklahoma Public Safety Agency. The Director shall have authority to delegate duties and responsibilities to the respective division directors and chiefs.
- D. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Director of the Oklahoma Public Safety Agency, created in Section 3 of this act, shall have authority to budget and expend the operating funds of the Agency.
- E. No later than December 1, 2021, the Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services, when directed to do so by the Director of the Oklahoma Public Safety Agency, shall transfer by monthly allocation any unencumbered funds originally appropriated to

the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation, Oklahoma State Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control, the Council on Law Enforcement Education and Training, the Office of the State Fire Marshal, the Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security, the Oklahoma Department of Emergency Management, the ABLE Commission and the Department of Public Safety for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2022, to the Oklahoma Public Safety Agency to operate the Oklahoma Public Safety Agency for the remainder of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2022. The funds transferred to the Oklahoma Public Safety Agency shall not be subject to any budgetary limits that may have attached to the funds when the funds were originally appropriated. Funds in revolving funds or otherwise not subject to fiscal year limitations previously available to the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation, Oklahoma State Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control, the Council on Law Enforcement Education and Training, the Office of the State Fire Marshal, the Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security, the Oklahoma Department of Emergency Management, the ABLE Commission and the Department of Public Safety, shall be transferred to the corresponding Oklahoma Public Safety Agency fund as provided by this act.

F. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Director of the Oklahoma Public Safety Agency shall have authority to administer all funds appropriated for the fiscal year ending on June 30, 2022, for the operation of the Department of Public Safety, the Oklahoma

State Bureau of Investigation and the Oklahoma Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control, the Council on Law Enforcement Education and Training and the Office of the State Fire Marshal, the Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security, the Oklahoma Department of Emergency Management and the ABLE Commission.

- SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 9101 of Title 74, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. The Governor shall appoint a Director for the Oklahoma

 Public Safety Agency who shall be subject to the advice, consent and confirmation by the Oklahoma State Senate. The Director of the Oklahoma Public Safety Agency shall serve at the pleasure of the Governor and may be removed or replaced without cause. Compensation for the Director shall be determined by the Governor. The Director may be removed from office by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the members elected to and constituting each chamber of the Legislature. The Director shall be qualified for such position by character, knowledge, skill, ability, education, training, administrative experience in the field of law enforcement, public safety or other relevant experience.
- B. Upon the effective date of this act, the Director of the Oklahoma Public Safety Agency shall have the authority to affirm the current Chief of Administration of the Department of Public Safety, Chief of the Oklahoma Highway Patrol, Director of the Oklahoma State

Bureau of Investigation and Director of the Oklahoma State Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control, Executive Director of the Council on Law Enforcement Education and Training and State Fire Marshal, the Director of the Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security, the Director of the Oklahoma Department of Emergency Management and the Director of the ABLE Commission as the Director or Chief of his or her respective division and to appoint a Director or Chief of a respective division if the current position is vacant.

- C. All functions currently performed by the Oklahoma Highway Patrol, Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation and Oklahoma State Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control, the Office of the State Fire Marshall, the Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security and the Oklahoma Department of Emergency Management shall remain under their respective division; provided, that this provision shall not necessarily apply to administrative, human resources, regulatory, licensing, certification and permitting functions.
- SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 9102 of Title 74, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. The Director of the Oklahoma Public Safety Agency shall have the following powers, duties and responsibilities:
- 1. Formulate and implement a unified law enforcement and public safety strategy for activities of the Agency with annual and long-term measurable goals and objectives to achieve greater public

safety, which shall be published on the Oklahoma Public Safety Agency website;

- 2. Act as Director of the Oklahoma Public Safety Agency;
- Appoint a Chief of Administration of the Public Safety Division, a Director of the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation Division, a Chief of the Oklahoma Highway Patrol Division and a Director of the Oklahoma State Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control Division, the Law Enforcement Education and Training Division, the State Fire Marshal Division, the Director of the Homeland Security Division, the Director of the Emergency Management Division and the Director of the ABLE Division, and any other directors, assistant directors, deputy directors and other staff that may be necessary and proper for the administration of the Oklahoma Public Safety Agency who shall serve at the pleasure of the Director of the Oklahoma Public Safety Agency. Any employee in a classified position under the Merit System of Personnel Administration who is appointed as staff of the Director shall have the right to return to the classified service without any loss of rights, privileges or benefits immediately upon completion of the duties of the employee provided, the employee is not otherwise disqualified. Classified personnel transferred from their respective division to the Oklahoma Public Safety Agency shall not be required to accept a lesser salary than presently received; provided, the provisions of this section shall not operate to

prohibit the imposition of furloughs or reductions-in-force with respect to such personnel as allowed by law. Personnel transferred shall be placed into an existing classified job family at the classification level in which they meet qualifications without an entrance exam or subject to any other competitive hiring process required by the Oklahoma Personnel Act or the Merit System of Personnel Administrative Rules. All such persons shall retain seniority, leave, sick and annual time earned and any retirement benefits which have accrued during their tenure with their respective division. The transfer of personnel among the divisions shall be coordinated with the Office of Management and Enterprise Services;

- 4. Administer the activities of the Oklahoma Public Safety
 Agency and all divisions under the control of the Department and act
 for the Agency in all matters, including budgetary matters and
 expenditures of the divisions, except as may be otherwise provided
 in this act;
- 5. Prepare proposed rules and regulations considered necessary for the operation of the Oklahoma Public Safety Agency;
- 6. By November 1, 2021, provide to the Governor, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the minority leaders of the Senate and House of Representatives, a plan for a unified position and compensation system for state law enforcement, a plan to unify state law

enforcement data collection and data systems, a plan to standardize and integrate operational boundaries for the Agency and a plan to develop a focused, common training and leadership development program for all members of the Agency;

- 7. Enter into contracts with public agencies, institutions of higher education and private organizations or individuals for the purpose of conducting research, demonstrations or special projects which bear directly on the operation of the Agency or the reduction of crime;
- 8. Enter into contracts for educational and research activities without performance bonds;
- 9. Create, modify, merge or reorganize any of the divisions or units within the Oklahoma Public Safety Agency as the Director may deem appropriate, consistent with this act, to effectively administer a unified law enforcement system in this state;
- 10. Commission employees as peace officers of the Oklahoma Public Safety Agency;
- 11. Investigate any complaint against the Oklahoma Public Safety Agency or any of its employees;
- 12. Be directly responsible for all monies appropriated for and deposited to the credit of the Oklahoma Public Safety Agency and each agency under its control and approve all claims and payments, or delegate responsibility, as provided in Section 34.68 of Title 62 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

- 13. Accept gifts, bequests, devices, contributions and grants, public or private, including federal funds or funds from any other source for use in furthering the purpose of the Agency;
- 14. Purchase, lease and maintain motor vehicles and other equipment and properties for use by employees of the Oklahoma Public Safety Agency;
- 15. Purchase or lease and equip motor vehicles for the use of the Governor and Lieutenant Governor;
- 16. Authorize the use of a state-owned motor vehicle as authorized in Section 156.1 of Title 47 of the Oklahoma Statutes;
- 17. Transfer assets within the Oklahoma Public Safety Agency as may be necessary and proper for the operation of the Agency;
- 18. Maintain records of all proceedings and official orders;
- 19. No later than December 1, 2021, all employees of the Oklahoma Public Safety Agency shall be under the authority of the Director and shall be exempt from OMES governance.
- B. After appointment and before entering upon the discharge of duties, the Director shall take and subscribe to the oath of office required by the Constitution. Bonding of the Director and other employees of the Oklahoma Public Safety Agency shall be provided under the provisions of Section 85.26 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

SECTION 5. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 9103 of Title 74, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

- A. There is hereby created an Investigation Oversight

 Commission which shall consist of seven (7) members appointed as

 follows:
 - 1. The Oklahoma Attorney General, or designee;
- 2. The Chief Justice of the Oklahoma Supreme Court, or designee;
 - 3. The Oklahoma State Auditor and Inspector, or designee;
 - 4. One member appointed by the Governor;

- 5. One member appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate;
- 6. One member appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives; and
 - 7. One member appointed by the District Attorneys Council.
- B. Each member shall serve so long as the member is qualified until a successor has been appointed. Members serve at the pleasure of his or her appointing authority. Vacancies shall be promptly filled by the respective appointing authority. Members shall not serve for more than six (6) consecutive years without two (2) years off the Commission.
- C. Annually, the Commission shall select one member of the Commission to serve as chair and one member to serve as vice-chair.

No member of the Commission may serve as chair for two (2) consecutive years but shall have a minimum of one year between times of service as chair. The chair shall preside at all meetings of the Commission and shall have the power to call meetings of the Commission. In addition, meetings of the Commission may be called by a majority of the members. The vice-chair shall perform these functions in the absence or incapacity of the chair. A quorum of four members of the Commission shall be necessary to conduct any official business. Any member of the Commission with a personal interest or conflict of interest shall disclose that fact to the members of the Commission and shall not participate in any way including but not limited to discussions, questions, debates and votes on Commission business in which a personal interest or conflict of interest exists. A simple majority of the members of the Commission who do not have a personal interest or conflict of interest shall constitute a quorum of the Commission necessary to conduct any official business in which a member or members disclosed a personal interest or conflict of interest. All actions taken by the Commission shall be by a simple majority vote of a quorum as established in this paragraph. In the event of a tie vote, the measure being voted upon shall be deemed to have failed. Commission shall adopt rules of procedure for the orderly performance of its functions.

Members of the Commission shall serve without salary but may be reimbursed for travel and other expenses of attending meetings and performing their duties in the manner provided for other state officers and employees under the State Travel Reimbursement Act. The lay-citizen members shall be paid Thirty Dollars (\$30.00) per diem for attendance at meetings of the Commission.

SECTION 6. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 9104 of Title 74, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The Investigation Oversight Commission shall have oversight of any investigation of the State Bureau of Investigation Division of the Oklahoma Public Safety Agency, not covered under Section 150.2 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes, as follows:

- Investigations initiated by the request of the following persons:
 - the Governor, a.
 - b. the Attorney General,
 - the Council on Judicial Complaints, upon a vote by a C. majority of the Council,
 - d. the chair of any Legislative Investigating Committee, which has been granted subpoena powers by resolution, upon authorization by a vote of the majority of the Committee,

- e. the Director of the Department of Human Services, or designee, as authorized by Section 1-2-105 of Title 10A of the Oklahoma Statutes, or
- f. a district court judge as authorized by Section 1-2-103 of Title 10A of the Oklahoma Statutes.
- 2. Requests for investigations shall be submitted in writing and shall contain specific allegations of wrongdoing under the laws of the State of Oklahoma.

SECTION 7. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 9105 of Title 74, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving fund for the Oklahoma Public Safety Agency to be designated the "Oklahoma Public Safety Agency Revolving Fund". The fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations, and shall consist of any monies received from the sale of surplus and confiscated property, fees and receipts collected pursuant to the Oklahoma Open Records Act, gifts, bequests, devises, contributions or grants, public or private, including federal funds unless otherwise provided by federal law or regulation, reimbursements, refunds, fees and receipts from any other source. All monies, and other money as provided by law, accruing to the credit of the fund are hereby appropriated and may be budgeted and expended by the Oklahoma Public Safety Agency for general operations of the agency.
