6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to film expenditure rebates; amending  
8 68 O.S. 2011, Section 3624, as last amended by  
9 Section 3, Chapter 313, O.S.L. 2019 (68 O.S. Supp.  
10 2019, Section 3624), which relates to the Oklahoma  
11 Film Enhancement Rebate Program; clarifying certain  
12 payments; limiting liability for payments to balance  
13 of specified fund; updating statutory reference;  
14 providing an effective date; and declaring an  
15 emergency.

16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

17 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 68 O.S. 2011, Section 3624, as  
18 last amended by Section 3, Chapter 313, O.S.L. 2019 (68 O.S. Supp.  
19 2019, Section 3624), is amended to read as follows:

20 Section 3624. A. There is hereby created the Oklahoma Film  
21 Enhancement Rebate Program. A rebate in the amount of up to  
22 seventeen percent (17%) of documented expenditures made in Oklahoma  
23 directly attributable to the production of a film, television  
24 production, or television commercial, as defined in Section 3623 of  
25 this title, in this state, may be paid to the production company  
26 responsible for the production. Provided, for documented  
27 expenditures made after July 1, 2009, the rebate amount shall be

1 thirty-five percent (35%), except as provided in subsection B of  
2 this section.

3 B. The amount of rebate paid to the production company as  
4 provided for in subsection A of this section shall be increased by  
5 an additional two percent (2%) of documented expenditures if a  
6 production company spends at least Twenty Thousand Dollars  
7 (\$20,000.00) for the use of music created by an Oklahoma resident  
8 that is recorded in Oklahoma or for the cost of recording songs or  
9 music in Oklahoma for use in the production.

10 C. The rebate program shall be administered by the Office of  
11 the Oklahoma Film and Music Commission and the Oklahoma Tax  
12 Commission, as provided in the Compete with Canada Film Act.

13 D. To be eligible for a rebate payment:

14 1. The production company responsible for a film, television  
15 production, or television commercial, as defined in Section 3623 of  
16 this title, made in this state shall submit documentation to the  
17 Office of the Oklahoma Film and Music Commission of the amount of  
18 wages paid for employment in this state to residents of this state  
19 directly relating to the production and the amount of other  
20 production costs incurred in this state directly relating to the  
21 production;

22 2. The production company has filed or will file any Oklahoma  
23 tax return or tax document which may be required by law;

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1           3. Except major studio productions, the production company  
2 shall provide the name of the completion guarantor and a copy of the  
3 bond guaranteeing the completion of the project or if a film has not  
4 secured a completion bond, the production company shall provide  
5 evidence that all Oklahoma crew and local vendors have been paid and  
6 there are no liens against the production company pending in the  
7 state;

8           4. The minimum budget for the film shall be Fifty Thousand  
9 Dollars (\$50,000.00) of which not less than Twenty-five Thousand  
10 Dollars (\$25,000.00) shall be expended in this state;

11           5. The production company shall provide evidence of financing  
12 for production prior to the commencement of principal photography;  
13 and

14           6. The production company shall provide evidence of a  
15 certificate of general liability insurance with a minimum coverage  
16 of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) and a workers' compensation  
17 policy pursuant to state law, which shall include coverage of  
18 employer's liability.

19           E. A production company shall not be eligible to receive both a  
20 rebate payment pursuant to the provisions of ~~this act~~ Section 3621  
21 et seq. of this title and an exemption from sales taxes pursuant to  
22 the provisions of paragraph 23 of Section 1357 of this title. If a  
23 production company has received such an exemption from sales taxes  
24 and submits a claim for rebate pursuant to the provisions of the

1 Compete with Canada Film Act, the company shall be required to fully  
2 repay the amount of the exemption to the Tax Commission. A claim  
3 for a rebate shall include documentation from the Tax Commission  
4 that repayment has been made as required herein or shall include an  
5 affidavit from the production company that the company has not  
6 received an exemption from sales taxes pursuant to the provisions of  
7 paragraph 21 of Section 1357 of this title.

8 F. The Office shall approve or disapprove all claims for rebate  
9 and shall notify the Tax Commission. The Tax Commission shall, upon  
10 notification of approval from the Office of the Film and Music  
11 Commission, issue payment for all approved claims from funds in the  
12 Oklahoma Film Enhancement Rebate Program Revolving Fund created in  
13 Section 3625 of this title. Excluding any rebate payments to high  
14 impact productions as provided for in subsection G of this section,  
15 the amount of ~~payments~~ claims prequalified and approved by the  
16 Office in any single fiscal year shall not exceed Eight Million  
17 Dollars (\$8,000,000.00). If the amount of approved claims exceeds  
18 the amount specified in this subsection in a fiscal year, payments  
19 shall be made in the order in which the claims are approved by the  
20 Office. If an approved claim is not paid in whole or in part, the  
21 unpaid claim or unpaid portion may be paid in the following fiscal  
22 year subject to the limitations specified in this subsection. The  
23 liability of the State of Oklahoma to make incentive payments  
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1 pursuant to this act shall be limited to the balance of the Oklahoma  
2 Film Enhancement Rebate Program Revolving Fund.

3 G. 1. At the time the Office of the Film and Music Commission  
4 issues a conditional prequalification for a production, such  
5 prequalification may include a proposed designation as a high impact  
6 production, as defined in Section 3623 of this title.

7 2. The proposed designation must be approved by the Cabinet  
8 Secretary for Commerce and Tourism.

9 3. If the high impact production otherwise meets all of the  
10 requirements of the Compete With Canada Act and the Office gives  
11 final approval to rebate claims, such rebate claims shall not be  
12 subject to the Eight Million Dollar (\$8,000,000.00) cap provided for  
13 in subsection F of this section.

14 4. The payment of a rebate claim approved by the Office for a  
15 production designated as a high impact production by the Cabinet  
16 Secretary may be made as follows:

- 17 a. by special appropriation to the Oklahoma Film  
18 Enhancement Rebate Program Revolving Fund, if the  
19 claim is approved during a regular or special session  
20 of the Oklahoma Legislature, or  
21 b. by payment from the Oklahoma Quick Action Closing Fund  
22 pursuant to Section 48.2 of Title 62 of the Oklahoma  
23 Statutes, if the claim is approved when the Oklahoma  
24 Legislature is not in session.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2020.

2 SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation  
3 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby  
4 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and  
5 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.  
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
