SENATE BILL 1867

AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to the Oklahoma Healthcare Authority;
requiring the Authority to conduct certain study;
requiring submission of certain report; providing for
codification; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 5009.7 of Title 63, unless there
is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. The Oklahoma Health Care Authority shall study the
feasibility of covering, under the state Medicaid program,
screenings for adverse childhood experiences and health outcomes
from positive experiences. The study may include, but shall not be
limited to:

1. A cost-benefit analysis of coverage of one annual screening
for child recipients of Medicaid and one lifetime screening for
adult recipients of Medicaid;

2. Training requirements or other qualifications for providers
who administer the screening; and

1 3. Standards and criteria for the screening.

2 B. The Authority shall submit a report to the President Pro
3 Tempore of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives
4 and the Governor on findings of the study.

5 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2020.

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
