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19	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
20	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 7 O.S. 2011, Section 8, is amended
21	to read as follows:
22	Section 8. (a) See Title 74, State Officers and Employees,
23	Section 285(23) note.
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1 The state plan for library services shall be amended in (b) A. 2 accordance with the Federal Library Services and Construction Act 3 and applicable regulations to reflect the authority and duty of the 4 Section of Services to the Blind (Visual Services) of the Commission 5 for Rehabilitation Services Division of Services for the Blind and 6 Visually Impaired of the State Department of Rehabilitation Services 7 to provide special library services, including braille and recorded 8 books, to blind and visually handicapped persons as provided by 9 state law.

10 (c) B. Special library services for blind and physically 11 handicapped adults, children, and students shall be provided by the 12 Section of Services to the Blind (Visual Services) of the Commission 13 for Rehabilitation Services Division of Services for the Blind and 14 Visually Impaired of the Department in accordance with the Federal 15 Library Services and Construction Act, as amended, and applicable 16 federal regulations relating thereto; and consistent with applicable 17 statutes and regulations. The library standards of the National 18 Accreditation Council for Agencies Serving the Blind and Visually 19 Handicapped shall be observed and followed in providing such special 20 library services. The Commission for Rehabilitation Services shall, 21 within the availability of state funds, annually make available for 22 such special library services sufficient funds to earn the maximum 23 available federal funds under the Federal Library Services and

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Construction Act and appropriations made in pursuance thereof by Congress.

³ (d) <u>C.</u> All federal requirements for interlibrary cooperation
⁴ and consultation shall be observed and entitlement of the Department
⁵ of Libraries to receive federal funds for library services or
⁶ construction shall not be impaired by any state law prescribing the
⁷ duties, responsibilities and functions of the Section of Services to
⁸ the Blind (Visual Services) Division of Services for the Blind and
⁹ Visually Impaired of the Department.

SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 7 O.S. 2011, Section 71, is amended to read as follows:

12 Section 71. A. For purposes of assisting blind persons to 13 become self-supporting, the State Department of Rehabilitation 14 Services is hereby authorized to carry on activities to promote 15 business opportunities for individuals who are blind, including, but 16 not limited to, the licensing and establishment of such persons as 17 operators of vending facilities in public and other buildings. 18 Facilities shall maximize job opportunities for other persons who 19 are blind.

B. The Department shall be the sole state licensing agency for the purpose of implementing and carrying out the provisions of the Act of Congress known as the Randolph-Sheppard Act (20 USCA Sections 107-107f), and amendments thereto, providing for the licensing of individuals who are blind to operate vending facilities in federal

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1 buildings, or any other Acts of Congress which may be hereafter 2 enacted. Provided, that no game of chance or gambling machine shall 3 be operated. The Division of Visual Services for the Blind and 4 Visually Impaired of the Department shall administer this program. 5 SECTION 3. 62 O.S. 2011, Section 34.77, as AMENDATORY 6 amended by Section 398, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2012 (62 O.S. Supp. 7 2018, Section 34.77), is amended to read as follows: 8 Section 34.77. A. The State Department of Rehabilitation 9 Services is authorized to establish an encumbrance and preaudit 10 system for settlement of claims relating to social service benefits 11 and medical benefits to or for persons eligible under applicable 12 federal laws and regulations, Oklahoma Statutes, and policies 13 established by the Commission for Rehabilitation Services for the 14 following programs: 15 1. Vocational and other rehabilitation; 16 2. Educational services; 17 3. Disability Determination Services; and 18 4. Visual Services for the Blind and Visually Impaired. 19 Prior to inclusion in this procedure, the State Department в. 20 of Rehabilitation Services shall provide to the Director of the

²³ programs specified in subsection A of this section.

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C. The State Department of Rehabilitation Services shall provide the Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services a daily report of the dollar amount of claims settled and checks or warrants issued, the dollar amount of checks or warrants canceled, and the dollar amount of checks or warrants canceled by statutes.

⁷ SECTION 4. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2011, Section 2701, is ⁸ amended to read as follows:

9 Section 2701. It is declared to be the public policy of this 10 state, in order to safeguard the public health, safety and welfare, 11 to encourage certain knowledgeable persons to make written report to 12 the Division of Visual Services for the Blind and Visually Impaired 13 of the State Department of Rehabilitation Services as to individuals 14 suffering from blindness or serious visual impairment so that said 15 the Division of Visual Services may inform them as to rehabilitative 16 education and training programs of the state.

SECTION 5. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2011, Section 2702, is amended to read as follows:

Section 2702. Any licensed surgeon, medical doctor, osteopathic physician, optometrist, dentist, intern or registered nurse who, from attending or examining an individual, concludes that such individual is blind or visually impaired to a material and uncorrected extent, and in good faith participates in the making of written report of said conclusion to the Division of Visual

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Services, Services for the Blind and Visually Impaired of the State Department of Rehabilitation Services, shall have immunity from liability, civil and criminal, for so reporting.

SECTION 6. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 3001, as
last amended by Section 117, Chapter 15, O.S.L. 2013 (74 O.S. Supp.
2018, Section 3001), is amended to read as follows:

7 Section 3001. A. There is hereby created in the Office of 8 Management and Enterprise Services a committee to be known as the 9 "State Use Committee". The Committee shall consist of seven (7) 10 members and one nonvoting member as follows:

11 1. A private citizen conversant with the employment needs of 12 people with severe disabilities who shall be appointed by and serve 13 at the pleasure of the Governor to act as an advocate for the 14 employment needs of people with severe disabilities;

15 2. The Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise 16 Services or designee;

17 3. The Director of Visual Services the Division of Services for 18 <u>the Blind and Visually Impaired of the State Department of</u> 19 Rehabilitation Services, or designee;

20 4. The past president of Oklahoma Community-Based Providers or 21 designee to serve for a one-year period, who may be reappointed by 22 the succeeding president;

5. An individual or a parent or guardian of an individual with severe disabilities who participates in vocational programming

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1 through a sheltered environment facility, to be selected by the 2 Committee;

6. The Director of Human Services, or designee;

A certified procurement officer from any state agency
appointed by the State Purchasing Director, selected to represent
the customer agencies of the State of Oklahoma; and

8. As a nonvoting member, a person employed by the Office of
Management and Enterprise Services as a contracting officer in the
purchasing division, appointed by the State Purchasing Director with
the advice of the Committee and designated specifically to solicit,
develop, and negotiate contracts with agencies and individuals.

B. The Committee shall elect from among its membership a Chair
 and a Vice Chair who shall both serve for a period of one (1) year.

14 C. The private citizen on the Committee shall serve for a 15 period of two (2) years and may be reappointed by the appointing 16 authority. Any private citizen appointed pursuant to this section 17 to fill a vacancy occurring prior to the expiration of the term for 18 which the predecessor was appointed shall be appointed only for the 19 remainder of the term.

D. Any member of the Committee shall be prohibited from voting
 on any issue in which the member has an interest.

SECTION 7. This act shall become effective November 1, 2019.
