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11	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
12	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2011, Section 1-237, is
13	amended to read as follows:
14	Section 1-237. 1. The Governor shall appoint an Interagency
15	Coordinating Council for Coordination of Efforts for Prevention of
16	Adolescent Pregnancy and Sexually Transmitted Diseases which will
17	continue until July 1, 2020, and shall be composed of thirty-one
18	(31) members as follows:
19	a. the chief executive officers or their designees of

21	(1) Commission on Children and Youth,
22	(2) State Department of Education,
23	(3) Oklahoma Department of Career and Technology
24	Education,

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1 (4)Department of Human Services, 2 (5) Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse 3 Services, 4 Office of Volunteerism, (6) 5 (7) State Department of Health, and 6 (8) College of Public Health, 7 b. the Executive Director of the Office of Juvenile 8 Affairs or designee, 9 C. two representatives from the Maternal and Infant 10 Health Division, two representatives from the HIV/STD 11 Division, two representatives from the Child Health 12 and Guidance Division of the State Department of 13 Health, 14 d. a superintendent of an independent school district, 15 a representative of a statewide association of medical е. 16 doctors, 17 f. a representative of a statewide association of 18 osteopathic physicians, 19 a representative of a statewide association of parents g. 20 and teachers, 21 a representative of a statewide association of h. 22 classroom teachers, 23 i. a representative of a statewide association of school 24 counselors,

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- j. a principal of an alternative education program,
- k. a representative of business or industry,
- a representative of a statewide association formed for the purpose of developing leadership skills,
- m. a representative of an ecumenical association,
- n. two parents of ten- to twenty-year-old children,
- o. a teenage girl,
- p. a representative of a nonprofit statewide child advocacy organization,
- q. the Governor or the Governor's designee, who shall chair the Coordinating Council.

Legal assistance shall be provided by the Office of the Attorney General. Staff support and assistance shall be provided by the State Department of Health as the legal agency.

- 2. The Coordinating Council shall:
 - a. on or before December 1, 1994, complete the State Plan pursuant to the provisions of Section 1-238 of this title and present it to the Committee for approval, and
 - b. after approval of the State Plan, monitor implementation of the plan, evaluate the plan, meet with the Committee concerning revisions whenever requested to do so, and on or before November 1, 1995, and November 1 of each subsequent year, submit a

5	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2019.
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
