A Joint Resolution directing the Secretary of State to refer to the people for their approval or rejection proposed amendments to Sections 2, 3 and 5 of Article 11 of the Oklahoma Constitution, which relate to the permanent school fund; providing for what constitutes the principal of the permanent school fund; removing language prohibiting the fund from being diminished; providing method for calculating the amount of annual distributions; directing the frequency of certain distributions, the percentage of distributions and certain definition to be provided for by law; providing ballot title; and directing filing.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 2ND SESSION OF THE 57TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:

SECTION 1. The Secretary of State shall refer to the people for their approval or rejection, as and in the manner provided by law, the following proposed amendment to Section 2 of Article XI of the Oklahoma Constitution to read as follows:

Section 2. All proceeds of the sale of public lands that have heretofore been or may be hereafter given by the United States for the use and benefit of the common schools of this State, all such

per centum as may be granted by the United States on the sales of public lands, the sum of five million dollars appropriated to the State for the use and benefit of the common schools in lieu of sections sixteen and thirty-six, and other lands of the Indian Territory, the proceeds of all property that shall fall to the State by escheat, the proceeds of all gifts or donations to the State for common schools not otherwise appropriated by the terms of the gifts, and such other appropriations, gifts, or donations as shall be made by the Legislature for the benefit of the common schools, shall constitute the permanent school fund, the income from which and all earnings including interest, dividends and capital gains from investment of the fund shall be credited to the principal of the fund. Distributions from the fund shall be used for the maintenance of the common schools in the State. The principal shall be deemed a trust fund held by the State, and shall forever remain inviolate. It may be increased, but shall never be diminished. The State shall reimburse said permanent school fund for all losses thereof which may in any manner occur, and no portion of said fund shall be diverted for any other use or purpose.

SECTION 2. The Secretary of State shall refer to the people for their approval or rejection, as and in the manner provided by law, the following proposed amendment to Section 3 of Article XI of the Oklahoma Constitution to read as follows:

1 Section 3. A. The interest and income of distributions from 2 the permanent school fund, the net income from the leasing of public 3 lands which have been or may be granted by the United States to the State for the use and benefit of the common schools, together with 5 any revenues derived from taxes authorized to be levied for such 6 purposes, and any other sums which may be added thereto by law, 7 shall be used and applied each year for the benefit of the common 8 schools of the State, and shall be, for this purpose, apportioned 9 among and between all the several common school districts of the 10 State in proportion to the school population of the several 11 districts, and no part of the fund shall ever be diverted from this 12 purpose, or used for any other purpose than the support and 13 maintenance of common schools for the equal benefit of all the 14 people of the State.

- B. The amount of the annual distribution shall be between four and three-quarters percent (4 3/4%) and five and one-half percent (5 1/2%) of the average year-end market value of the funds for the immediately preceding three (3) fiscal years.
- C. The frequency of the distributions, percentage of distributions and definition of "market value" pursuant to subsection B of this section shall be as provided by law.

SECTION 3. The Secretary of State shall refer to the people for their approval or rejection, as and in the manner provided by law,

the following proposed amendment to Section 5 of Article XI of the Oklahoma Constitution to read as follows:

Section 5. Section thirteen in every portion of the State, which has been granted to the State, shall be preserved for the use and benefit of the University of Oklahoma and the University Preparatory School, one-third; of the normal schools now established, or hereafter to be established, one-third; and of the Agricultural and Mechanical College and Colored Agricultural and Normal University, one-third. The said lands or the proceeds thereof as above apportioned to be divided between the institutions as the Legislature may prescribe: Provided, That the said lands so reserved, or the proceeds of the sale thereof, or of any indemnity lands granted in lieu of section thirteen shall be safely kept or invested and preserved by the State as a trust, which shall never be diminished, but may be added to, and the income thereof, interest, rentals, or otherwise, only. Distributions from the fund shall be used exclusively for the benefit of said educational institutions. Such educational institutions shall remain under the exclusive control of the State and no part of the proceeds arising from the sale or disposal of any lands granted for educational purposes, or the income or rentals thereof, shall be used for the support of any religious or sectarian school, college, or university, and no portion of the funds arising from the sale of sections thirteen or any indemnity lands selected in lieu thereof, either principal or

2	from the purpose for which said lands were granted to the State.
3	SECTION 4. The Ballot Title for the proposed Constitutional
4	amendments as set forth in SECTIONS 1, 2 and 3 of this resolution
5	shall be in the following form:

8	THE GIST OF THE PROPOSITION IS AS FOLLOWS:
9	This measure amends Section 2 of Article 11 of the Oklahoma
10	Constitution. The measure clarifies what makes up the permanent
11	school fund. It removes language stating that the permanent
12	school fund can be increased but can never be diminished. This
13	measure also amends Section 3 of Article 11 of the Oklahoma
14	Constitution. The measure provides a method to calculate annual
15	distributions from the permanent school fund to certain
16	educational institutions. It also directs certain items to be
17	provided for by law. This measure also amends Section 5 of
18	Article 11 of the Oklahoma Constitution. It removes language
19	stating that the permanent school fund can be increased but can
20	never be diminished.
