- 4 Section 5-4.1 This act shall be known and may be cited as the

- 6 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY Section 2, Chapter 40, O.S.L.
- 7 2013, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 85, O.S.L. 2017, and as
- 8 | renumbered by Section 4, Chapter 85, O.S.L. 2017 (2 O.S. Supp. 2019,

- 10 Section 5-4.2 As used in the Home Bakery Homemade Food Act of
- 11 2013 2020:
- 12 1. "Delivered" shall mean transferred to the consumer either
- 13 | immediately on sale or at a time thereafter;
- 14 | 2. "Home food establishment" shall mean a business on the
- 15 premises of a residence in which prepared food is created for sale
- 16 or resale at farmers markets, on site, at cooperatives, through
- 17 | membership-based buying clubs or for delivery, or other purposes, if
- 18 | the business has gross annual sales of prepared food of less than
- 19 | Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00) One Hundred Thousand Dollars
- 20 (\$100,000.00). Gross annual sales includes all sales of prepared
- 21 | food produced by the business at any location; and
- 22 2. 3. "Prepared Homemade food item" shall mean a food item,
- 23 | including a nonalcoholic beverage, which is produced and, if
- 24 packaged, packaged at the private residence of the producer any

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1 baked goods except for products that contain meat products or fresh
2 fruit;
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- 4. "Nonpotentially hazardous", in relation to food, shall mean food that does not require time or temperature control for safety to limit pathogenic microorganism growth or toxin formation;
- 5. "Potentially hazardous", in relation to food, shall mean food that requires time or temperature control for safety to limit pathogenic microorganism growth or toxin formation;
- 9 6. "Produce" shall mean to prepare a food item by cooking,
 10 baking, drying, mixing, cutting, canning, fermenting, preserving,
 11 dehydrating, growing, raising, or other process;
- 12 7. "Producer" shall mean the person who produces a homemade

 13 food item;
 - 8. "Seller" shall mean the person who sells a homemade food

 item to a consumer. The seller of a nonpotentially hazardous

 homemade food item may be the producer of the item, an agent of the

 producer, or a third-party vendor, such as a retail shop or grocery

 store. The seller of a potentially hazardous homemade food item

 must be the producer of the item; and
 - 9. "State" shall mean the State of Oklahoma and its political subdivisions.
- SECTION 3. AMENDATORY Section 3, Chapter 40, O.S.L. 23 2013, as amended by Section 2, Chapter 85, O.S.L. 2017, and as

A home food establishment may sell prepared 4 food on site, by delivery, at a farmers market, through a 5 cooperative, or through a membership-based buying club. The Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry may 6 7 promulgate rules to allow sales at other locations or by other 8 means. 9 B. A home food establishment that does not produce potentially 10 hazardous homemade food items shall be exempt from the licensing and 11 other requirements of the State Department of Health only if the 12 following conditions are satisfied: 1.3 1. Nonpotentially hazardous food items are sold to the 14 consumer: 15 by the producer, whether in person or remotely, a. 16 including but not limited to by telephone or Internet, 17 at a farmers market, through a cooperative, through a b. 18 membership-based buying club, 19 by an agent of the producer, who: C. 20 has full contact information, including telephone (1)2.1 number and physical address of the producer, and

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has personally met the producer, or

by a third-party vendor such as a retail shop or

- on a placard displayed at the point of sale if the homemade food item is neither packaged nor offered for sale from a bulk container, or
- on the webpage on which the homemade food item is offered for sale, if the homemade food item is offered for sale on the Internet.

If the homemade food item is sold by telephone or custom order, the seller shall not be required to display the information required by paragraph 3 of this subsection, but the seller shall disclose to the consumer that the homemade food item is produced at a private residence and may contain allergens. If the homemade food item is potentially hazardous, the seller shall disclose that this product required proper time and temperature control for safety and to avoid potential food-borne illness. The seller shall have the information required by subparagraphs a, b and c of paragraph 3 of this subsection readily available and provide it to the consumer upon request; and

5. The homemade food item shall not be meat, meat byproduct,
meat food product, poultry, poultry byproduct or poultry food
product, or any term defined by the federal Meat Inspection Act and
federal Poultry Products Inspection Act, unless the production and
sale of the item:

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        B. Nothing in the Homemade Food Act shall be construed to
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    impede the Department of Health in any investigation of a reported
    foodborne illness, including warrants to compel search or
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    inspection, or to preclude an agency from providing assistance,
    consultation, or inspection at the request of the producer of a

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        C. The Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry
    may, upon a consumer complaint, request written documentation to
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    verify the gross annual sales of a home food establishment.

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        Section 5-4.6 Nothing in the Home Bakery Homemade Food Act of

    2013 2020 shall be construed to prevent counties from enacting
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ordinances regulating the operation of home food establishments,

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provided such ordinances do not conflict with the provisions of the $\frac{\text{Home Bakery}}{\text{Homemade Food Act of } 2013}$ 2020.

- SECTION 6. AMENDATORY Section 2, Chapter 20, O.S.L. 2013

 (63 O.S. Supp. 2019, Section 1-1331), is amended to read as follows:

 Section 1-1331. A. Beekeepers with annual production of less

 than five hundred (500) gallons who do not qualify for the exemption

 under subsection A of Section 5-4.3 of Title 2 of the Oklahoma

 Statutes shall be exempt from regulation and inspection by the State

 Department of Health for the manufacture, sale, and distribution of honey and honeycomb products in Oklahoma if they meet the following requirements:
- The beekeeper shall only sell or distribute honey or honeycomb produced from hives located wholly within the State of Oklahoma which are owned and managed by the beekeeper;
- 2. The honey, honeycomb, or combination thereof is raw and not blended with other products or otherwise adulterated. The honey may be in liquid or solid form or a combination of the two;
- 3. The honey or honeycomb shall only be sold or distributed in person by the producer to the end-use customer at the beekeeper's home, farmer's markets, roadside stands, county fairs, or similar events; by the beekeeper or members of the beekeeper's immediate family or by an agent of the producer, a third-party vendor or a third-party carrier to the customer; and

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4. Honey products shall be labeled with the common food product name, net weight of the honey, the beekeeper's name, current ten (10) digit phone number, an address where the honey or honeycomb was produced, and shall include the statement, "Bottled or packaged in a facility not inspected by the Oklahoma Department of Health." The statement shall be in 10-point type or greater in a color that provides clear contrast to the background label.
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- B. No county, municipal corporation, consolidated government, or political subdivision of this state shall adopt or continue in effect any ordinance, rule, regulation, or resolution prohibiting, impeding, or restricting honey sales or distribution in compliance with this law.
- SECTION 7. REPEALER Section 4, Chapter 40, O.S.L. 2013, as renumbered by Section 6, Chapter 85, O.S.L. 2017 (2 O.S. Supp. 2019, Section 5-4.4), is hereby repealed.
- SECTION 8. This act shall become effective November 1, 2020.
