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L7	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
L8	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
L 9	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 3301.1 of Title 68, unless there
20	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
21	A. The board of county commissioners may call for an election
22	on the question of whether to require the payment of the nonresident
23	real property ownership charge as provided by this section.

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B. The question must be approved by a majority vote of the board of county commissioners. The question shall be submitted to the voters of the county in the same manner as other questions, but may be included on a general election date if the question is approved for submission not later than ninety (90) days prior to such general election. If the question is submitted during a year in which no general election occurs, the question shall be governed by the provisions of Section 12-116 of Title 26 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

- C. If approved by a majority of the voters voting on the question, the nonresident real property ownership charge shall be collected by the county treasurer in the same manner as ad valorem taxes and the charge shall be included with the ad valorem tax bill with respect to any real property owned by a nonresident during the applicable year.
- D. If real property owned by a nonresident is located in a county that approves the imposition of the charge authorized by this section, any person who is not a resident of the state who has title to real property located in the state, whether alone or together with other persons, shall be required to make an additional payment to the county treasurer of the county where the land is located in the amount of seventy-five percent (75%) of the ad valorem tax liability for each parcel of real property owned by the nonresident

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and located in the county approving the charge for the immediately preceding tax year.

- E. The county treasurer shall transfer the payment required by this section to the county general fund and the funds shall be expended for construction and improvement of county roads and bridges.
- F. The question to suspend or eliminate the charge previously approved at an election authorized by this section may also be submitted to the voters of the county in the same manner as provided for the question of imposing the charge. If approved by a majority of the voters of the county voting on the question, the charge shall be suspended or eliminated as provided for in the ballot title describing the question.
- SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2020.

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
