7 An Act relating to professions and occupations;
8 amending 59 O.S. 2011, Section 632, which relates to
9 the National Board of Osteopathic Medical Examiners;
10 requiring criminal history check; and providing an
11 effective date.

12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

13 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2011, Section 632, is
14 amended to read as follows:

15 Section 632. A. The examination of those who desire to
16 practice as osteopathic physicians shall embrace those general
17 subjects and topics, a knowledge of which is commonly and generally
18 required of candidates for a D.O. degree, Doctor of Osteopathy or
19 Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine, by accredited osteopathic colleges
20 in the United States. An examination furnished by the National
21 Board of Osteopathic Medical Examiners shall be deemed to fulfill
22 this requirement.

1 B. The applicant may be accepted who has successfully completed
2 the examination sequence of the National Board of Osteopathic
3 Medical Examiners and meets all other requirements.

4 C. The State Board of Osteopathic Examiners shall have
5 exclusive power and authority to determine the qualifications and
6 fitness of all applicants for admission to practice osteopathic
7 medicine in Oklahoma and shall require that each applicant submit to
8 a national criminal history record check as defined in Section 150.9
9 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

10 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2020.
