L3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
L 4	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
L 5	codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:
L 6	It shall be the public policy of the State of Oklahoma to:
L 7	1. Recognize and support individuals with disabilities by
L 8	treating them with dignity and respect as productive members of our

disabilities ensuring that the individuals, their families or

- guardians are well informed as to the types of services and
  resources available to such individuals in order to encourage their
  independence, self-esteem and self-worth, regardless of the severity
  of the disability;
  - 4. Recognize that self-choice on the part of individuals with disabilities is critical and that priority shall be given to providing services to people with disabilities in the most integrated setting; and

- 5. Recognize that institutional services shall be considered only as a last resort, ensuring that all resources available shall be exhausted prior to institutional placement.
- SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:
- A. There is hereby appropriated to the State Department of Rehabilitation Services from any monies not otherwise appropriated from the General Revenue Fund of the State Treasury for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2021, the sum of Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) or so much thereof as may be necessary to contract with Oklahoma's Federally Recognized Centers for Independent Living pursuant to the provisions of subsection B of this section.
- B. The State Department of Rehabilitation Services shall use the monies appropriated pursuant to subsection A of this section to contract with federally recognized Centers for Independent Living

for services related to the utilization, development and implementation of health and wellness programs that:

- 1. Help individuals achieve full participation through health maintenance and health promotion activities, including workshops that introduce individuals to a process for setting and clarifying goals and teach individuals how to generate, implement and monitor solutions to problems;
- 2. Present health promotion concepts to help individuals develop lifestyle behaviors that can reduce the limitations they experience from secondary health conditions that act as potential barriers to employment; and
- 3. Help minimize the negative consequences and impacts for individuals facing housing transitions.
- SECTION 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 2020.
- SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
