The Secretary of State shall refer to the people for 16 their approval or rejection, as and in the manner provided by law, 17 the following proposed amendment to the Constitution of the State of 18 Oklahoma by adding a new Section 8H to Article X thereof, to read as 19 follows: 20 Section 8H. Beginning January 1, 2021, the net assessed value 21 of the homestead of a disabled veteran having a permanent disability

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rating as established by the United States Department of Veterans

Affairs of at least ninety percent (90%) but less than one hundred

percent (100%) shall be reduced by fifty percent (50%) from the net

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1	assessed value otherwise applicable to the property for that year as
2	determined by the county assessor. The provisions of this section
3	shall be operative until the homestead of such disabled veteran is
4	sold or otherwise transferred.
5	SECTION 2. The Ballot Title for the proposed Constitutional
6	amendment as set forth in SECTION 1 of this resolution shall be in
7	the following form:

10	THE GIST OF THE PROPOSITION IS AS FOLLOWS:
11	This measure would amend the Oklahoma Constitution. It would
12	add a new Section 8H to Article 10. If a veteran has a
13	permanent disability rating of at least ninety percent (90%) but
14	no higher than one hundred percent (100%), the taxable value of
15	their homestead would be reduced by fifty percent (50%). This
16	reduced taxable value would remain until the disabled veteran
17	sold the property or it was otherwise transferred. This change
18	would become effective for the first time for the 2021
19	assessment year.
