**Research Analysis**

HB1055, as introduced, relates to required drug testing prior to prescribing any Schedule II or opioid drug. The measure requires that before prescribing any Schedule II or opioid drug for 3 months or longer, a practitioner must administer a drug test, initially and periodically, to determine the presence of any illicit drugs, prescribed drugs, or non-prescribed drugs. The measure exempts patients receiving treatment for cancer, patients receiving hospice care, patients in long-term care facilities, and patients prescribed any medication for the purpose of treating substance abuse or opioid dependence. The measure also defines drug testing (baseline and periodic), chronic pain, and opioid.
