Impact:	Adds an additional 85% crime, possible increase in DOC incarceration costs

Research Analysis

The Committee Substitute to HB 1056 adds domestic assault and battery as an offense requiring a person to serve 85% of the sentence imposed before being eligible for parole consideration. The measure also adds domestic assault and battery as a violent offense.

Fiscal Analysis

The CS on HB 1056, which adds domestic assault and battery as an 85% crime, could increase the number of inmates in DOC custody. It currently costs DOC on average, \$58.70/day or \$21,425.50/year to incarcerate one inmate. The overall impact is contingent upon how many individuals are found guilty of the crime.
