**Research Analysis**

The proposed committee substitute to HB1308 requires an officer or employee of a school district or member of a board of education to notify law enforcement of any verbal threat or act of threatening behavior by a student, and to comply with state and federal laws applicable to the release of student education records. The measure defines “threatening behavior.”

The proposed committee substitute also requires a school district to develop a policy for determining if a student who engages in threatening behavior needs to complete a mental health assessment prior to returning to school.
