Research Analysis

The Conference Committee substitute to HB 1927 lowers from a felony to a misdemeanor crime of assault and battery upon a medical care provider from 2 years imprisonment to 1 year imprisonment. The measure lowers the term of incarceration to up to one year in the county jail. The measure increases the term of imprisonment for a person who commits aggravated assault and battery upon medical care providers from not more than 1 year imprisonment to not more than 5 years imprisonment. The measure amends the definition of “medical care provider” to include laboratory technicians, radiologic technologists, pharmacists, physical therapists, physician assistants, hospital chaplains, medical students, nursing students, pharmacy students, and hospital employees.
