HB 1953, as introduced, authorizes state agencies to offer employees an option to be paid for a maximum of 200 hours of unused accrued annual leave, as long as the employee retains 120 hours of leave after the payment is made.

Fiscal Analysis

HB 1953 in its current form allows state agencies to buy-back annual leave from employees under certain conditions. HB 1953 is permissive and it is assumed that a state agency would only elect to participate if the agency had existing budgetary resources available to buy-back leave; therefor, HB 1953 does not mandate activity that would require additional appropriations or funding. Officials from the Office of Management and Enterprise Services (OMES) does not anticipate the need for additional resources to perform the duties placed upon OMES by HB 1953.
