**Research Analysis**

The committee substitute to HB 2363 provides for a definition of “bottle service” as used in the Oklahoma Alcoholic Beverage Control Act. The measure authorizes the holder of a retail spirits license to serve free samples of spirits, wine and beer within the licensed premises and at public events. The retail spirits license holder may also hold events to promote, educate or entertain on or off the premises for which admission may be charged and at with spirits, wine or beer may be sold and consumed. The measure authorizes a mixed beverage license holder to sell and/or serve free samples of spirits, wine and beer for consumption on the premises under certain conditions. The measure removes the requirement that ABLE Commission revoke a license in a civil case that determines the licensee knowing sold to a person under 21 years of age. Removes a prohibition that a spouse of retail spirits holder not hold any other license. The measure allows the holder of a Direct Wine Shipper's Permit may ship wine, as authorized by this section, from any of its licensed premises in its state of residence or from a fulfillment warehouse with which it has contracted. The bill allows an establishment to provide more than two drinks at one time, offer discounts and offer food and beverage as a single item. The measure allows persons under twelve years of age to accompany an adult into a retail spirits premises.
