**Research Analysis**

The Committee Substitute to HB 2369 creates the Criminal Justice Coordinating Commission. The 12-member Commission to be chaired by the Attorney General is to study, evaluate and make recommendations concerning the creation of diversion programs in Oklahoma including, but not limited to, alternative sentencing, supervision and treatment options for defendants who commit simple possession crimes. The Commission shall also study, evaluate and make recommendations regarding all criminal justice reform measures and legislation proposed. The Commission is to prepare a report of its findings and recommendations to the Legislature no later than February 1, 2020 and each year thereafter by February 1.
