**Research Analysis**

The committee substitute to HB 2528 provides that a driver convicted of a speeding violation in excess of fifteen miles per hour over the posted speed limit in school or work zones is not to be granted leniency or excusal from paying the fine. The measure provides that no citations for speeding in excess of fifteen miles per hour over the posted speed limit in school or work zones be included in any audit conducted to determine the percentage of fines derived from traffic citations.
