Research Analysis

The Committee Substitute for HB 2882 gives oversight of the Oklahoma Emergency Telephone Act to the Oklahoma 9-1-1 Management Authority and directs the Oklahoma 9-1-1 Management Authority to develop training standards for 9-1-1 call takers that include training program standards which include high-quality Telecommunicator CPR that can be provided by 9-1-1 call takers for acute events requiring CPR including; and follow evidence-based, nationally recognized guidelines for high-quality Telecomunicator CPR which incorporates recognition protocols for out-of-hospital cardiac arrest and continuous education.

The measure repeals 63 O.S. 2011, Section 2818.4, which relates to presumption of providers' obligation to participate in 9-1-1 service; and repeals 63 O.S. 2011, Section 2820, which relates to notification of use of 9-1-1 number for nonemergency calls.

Fiscal Analysis

HB 2882 in its current form modifies the powers and duties of the Oklahoma 9-1-1 Management Authority, related to developing training program standards. Legal, administrative, fiscal and staff support for the Authority is provided by the Oklahoma Department of Emergency Management, but expenses related to such services are reimbursable from the Oklahoma 9-1-1 Management Authority Revolving Fund. Any increase in administrative costs related to the provisions of this measure, which are not expected to be significant, are anticipated to be absorbed by such revolving funds. For this reason HB 2882 in its current form is not expected to impact the State's appropriated budget.
