**Research Analysis**

HB 3024 removes the limitation on the prosecution of sexual crimes against children and child trafficking to allow the prosecution to be commenced at any time after the commission of the offense.

**Fiscal Analysis**

HB 3024, as introduced, removes statutory limitations on the prosecution of sexual crimes against children and child trafficking. This could increase the amount of individuals found guilty and incarcerated: however, House fiscal staff finds the potential fiscal impact on the Dept. of Corrections to be negligible.
