Research Analysis

HB 3026 clarifies that employees of a political subdivision may voluntarily commit to perform duties, functions and activities in support of private nonprofit social, health and welfare organizations. Commitment of that support may occur during the employee's work hours and on public property, subject to permission of the political subdivision. The political subdivision shall establish an oversight committee to establish rules to manage employees' involvement in the organizations when conducted during work hours and on public property.

Finally, the measure provides that nothing precludes or prevents the political subdivision from supporting an employee's voluntary commitment to the organizations by providing materials, supplies, equipment, location, and use of public property.
