**Research Analysis**

HB 3028 authorizes governmental entities, religious institutions, nonprofit organizations, for-profit companies and tribal governments to offer harm-reduction services . Entities offering harm-reduction services shall register with the State Department of Health and may engage in activities in order to reduce the use of drugs, prevent outbreaks of infectious diseases and reduce morbidity among people who use injection drugs.
