**CareerTech: No Impact**

**Research Analysis**

The committee substitute to HB 3085 directs insurers to reduce premiums for workers' compensation insurance if the insured is certified as a work-based learning employer. The bill requires the insurance commissioner and the State Board of Career and Technology Education to conduct a study determining the impact of the discounts on encouraging employers to provide work-based learning opportunities.

To be eligible for the premium discount, work-based employers must enter a training agreement with at least one work-based learning student, the student's parents/guardians, and the student's school; develop a training plan; assign a mentor to each student; provide workers' compensation insurance for each student; and comply with all applicable rules and laws.

Self-insured employers may also be certified as work-based learning employers.
