**Research Analysis**

The committee substitute for HB 3142 provides flexibility for those seeking a school principal certification who completed their higher education requirements before July 1, 2005.

Currently, a school principal must complete a standard master's degree, and a program in education administration approved by the Oklahoma Commission for Teacher Preparation with an emphasis on curriculum, instruction and building-level relationships.

The committee substitute for HB 3142 would allow a person who has completed a master's degree program in education that includes competencies that are substantially equal to those listed in the above paragraph, to qualify for the principal certification requirements as long as their master's degree was completed prior to July 1, 2005.
