**Research Analysis**

HB 3210, as introduced, eliminates the emergency teaching certification, but maintains that the State Board of Education may issue provisional or transitional teaching certifications as necessary.

The measure clarifies that teaching certificates issued through the “New and Innovative Pathways Toward Teacher Certification Program” (70 OS 6-133) shall be considered equivalent to standard or traditional teaching certificates.

Lastly the measure requires the State Department of Education to annually report to the State Board of Education which types of teaching certificates are issued each year.
