**Research Analysis**

The committee substitute for HB 3236 creates the “Seizure Safe Schools Act” and requires each school to have one employee who is trained to recognize the signs of a seizure and trained to administer or assist with the self-administration of seizure rescue medicine. Before a school employee can administer seizure rescue medicine to a student, the parent or guardian shall provide the school with a written statement authorizing the school employee to administer the medicine, provide a written statement from the student’s health care provider with details about the medicine and the student’s condition, and provide the school with medicine in a sealed package. The parent or guardian must also work with the school employee to create a seizure action plan.
