**Research Analysis**

The Proposed Committee Substitute for HB 3274 exempts the Oklahoma Municipal Power Authority from the Oklahoma Open Records Act and the Oklahoma Open Meetings Act for matters relating to security plans and procedures, and from the Information Technology Consolidation and Coordination Act.

**Fiscal Analysis**

HB 3274 in its current form exempts the Oklahoma Municipal Power Authority from provisions of law, including the Information Technology Consolidation and Coordination Act. The Oklahoma Municipal Power Authority is a nonappropriated state agency; therefore, any increased costs or savings realized by the Authority will be absorbed within the Authority's budget. HB 3274 is expected to have no direct fiscal impact on state appropriations or revenues.
