**Research Analysis**

The Proposed Committee Substitute for HB 3289 modifies the licensure requirements related to scrap metal dealing, alcoholic beverages, motor vehicle dealing, used motor vehicle and parts dealing, and medical micropigmentation. The measure prohibits licensure if the applicant has been convicted or pled guilty to a felony substantially relating to the licensed practice and poses a reasonable threat to public safety, rather than a crime involving moral turpitude.
