## **Research Analysis**

The Committee Substitute to HB 3373 creates the "Shelby Johnson and Logan Deardorff Act of 2020". The bill requires a physician or doctor to notify the Department of Public Safety with 1 week of diagnosis of any illness or injury that would impair the ability of an individual to operate a motor vehicle. A physician who intentionally violates the provisions may be charged with a misdemeanor.

## **Fiscal Analysis**

HB 3373, which deals with procedures surrounding alerting the Department of Public Safety (DPS) of medical conditions, creates a misdemeanor. This could increase revenue for the state. The overall impact is dependent on how many individuals are cited and the fine they are required to pay. This is expected to be negligible. The measure also requires DPS to promulgate rules. This is anticipated to be a minimal impact.
