**Research Analysis**

HB 3373 creates the "Shelby Johnson and Logan Deardorf Act of 2020". The bill requires every person with knowledge of an individual afflicted with any illness or injury that would impair the ability of that individual in any manner as to affect the performance of the individual to operate a motor vehicle shall inform the Department of the individual and his or her condition by making a written report or telephone call to the Department. A physician or doctor is required to notify the Department of Public Safety with 1 week of diagnosis of any illness or injury that would impair the ability of an individual. A physician who intentionally violates the provisions may be charged with a misdemeanor. A second or subsequent offense is a felony. The Department shall appoint an independent physician or qualified medical personnel to review medical records on a case-by-case basis.
