HB 3399 provides that a law enforcement officer is immune from civil liability for any damage resulting from the forcible entry into a motor vehicle for the purpose of removing an animal from the motor vehicle if the vehicle is locked and the officer has a good-faith belief that the animal is in imminent danger of suffering harm.
