**Research Analysis**

HB 3482 modifies the Oklahoma Veterinary Practice Act by:

- Redefining “telemedicine” to require consultations be conducted via video;
- Defines “probably cause committee,” which settles disputes in accordance with the act;
- Extends the sunset for the State Board of Veterinary Medical Examiners to July 1, 2025;
- Authorizes the State Board of Veterinary Medical Examiners to grant scholarships;
- Creates an expedited veterinary medicine or veterinary technician license procedure for active military or spouse and waives the application fee;
- Removes grandfather clauses regarding qualifications for nonveterinary reproductive services technicians and nonveterinary equine dental care providers; and
- Extends the sunset for the rural veterinary training program at Oklahoma State University to July 1, 2025.
