Research Analysis

The FA to HB 3483 makes multiple changes to the Oklahoma Surprise Billing Protection Act, including:

- Exempting ambulance bills from the provisions of the measure,
- Increasing the surprising billing reimbursement from 130% to 150% of the Employees Group Insurance Division's current contracted rate,
- Removing the requirement that insurers notify providers of covered services on a regular basis,
- Allowing for communication between insurers or providers and patients to state that patients may be responsible for costs of non-covered services,
- Removing the prohibition that a non-participating provider may not induce patients to seek services from that provider,
- Removing the requirement that if mediation is requested, the affected insurer and provider must participate in the mediation,
- Removing the requirement that mediation be preceded by a teleconference within 30 days of mediation being requested, and
- Removing the provision that following mediation, the non-prevailing party is responsible for all costs associated with the mediation.
