Research Analysis

The committee substitute for HB 3561 creates the “school athlete concussion registry” within the State Department of Health. The registry shall include a statewide database of all reported concussions or suspected concussions and deaths of athletes that occur during a school practice or competition. Public school game officials are required to enter into the registry every time an athlete is removed from practice or competition for exhibiting signs of a concussion or head injury.

Fiscal Analysis

Health Department:

1 FTE- AA (\$36,500*1.55=\$56,575)

- [Supplies and printing for outreach/promotion on the reporting process \(about 550 school districts and likely that number or more youth sports organizations\) - \\$5,000 \(based on similar requests for outreach/promotion items\)](#)
- Phone costs - \$0 (a part of data cost)
- Data costs - \$10,800 -----(\$3,600 data cost*3 FTE)
- Travel reimbursement - \$9,000 ----- (20 members*25% out of town)*(\$150 average claim)*(12 months)
 - Maybe 15-20 members for the Board – we’d need specific expertise: physicians, rehab (PT/OT), coaches, school admin/OSDE, officials, OSSAA, youth sports, athletic trainers, etc. We have a concussion coalition currently that has about 25% of members from outside the metro (e.g., Tulsa, Stillwater).

Upon review, it is anticipated that this measure will not result in a negative fiscal impact on the state education budget or appropriations.
