**Research Analysis**

HB 3664 directs the board of county commissioners to provide space and personnel for the drug court program, if the county has established one. The board may create a public trust and enter into agreements to implement and operate the drug court program. With approval from the district court, the board may contract with a person or entity to serve as the coordinator of the drug court program.
