Research Analysis

HB 3871, as introduced, requires public high schools to provide remediation to any student who:

- Does not perform at proficiency level on required state assessments
- Is determined to be academically ineligible for concurrent enrollment
- Scores below the mean score on a commercial college readiness assessment

The measure also prevents colleges and universities from charging students tuition for remedial courses that earn the student no credit, unless the course is part of a corequisite model of remediation.
