The committee substitute to HB 4080 changes the entity responsible for employing professional investigators, clerical and administrative personnel of the Pardon and Parole Board from the Pardon and Parole Board to the Department of Corrections.

**Fiscal Analysis**

HB 4080, in effect, consolidates the Pardon and Parole Board (PPB) into the Department of Corrections (DOC). The fiscal impact is neutral, as both the agency's duties and operating funding will be transferred to DOC. PPB is currently 100% funded via state appropriations and in FY-20 received \$2,368,125 total from the General Revenue Fund for all operations. It is assumed this amount will be appropriated to DOC in future fiscal years.
