Research Analysis

HB 4106, as introduced, requires each district board of education, beginning with the 2021-2022 school year, to offer teachers an annual training in violence de-escalation. The measure also requires emergency certified teachers or provisionally certified teachers to be trained in violence de-escalation for each year they hold the emergency or provisional teaching certificate.

Fiscal Analysis

The measure requires an individual receive training in violence de-escalation each school year. It is estimated that doing so through a contract with an outside consultant would range from \$1,250 for one-day training to \$3,645 for a four-day certification program.

If the State Department of Education provided this training, it is estimated that the agency would result in a fiscal impact of \$100,000 to develop and provide the program training, as well as salary, benefits, travel and materials.
