Research Analysis

Senate Bill 1203 separates a charter school from its sponsor for funding purposes. The measure requires the attendance of the charter school to be considered separate from the attendance of its sponsoring district. The sum of the separate attendance calculations is no longer used to determine the total state aid allocation of the sponsoring district.

The measure requires all charter schools to be considered their own local education agency for the purposes of all funding.

Lastly, the legal average daily attendance, for purposes of the distributions of apportionments of gross production taxes, motor vehicle tax collections, and Land Commission earnings, shall not include average daily attendance for students enrolled in a charter school.
