Research Analysis

SB 166 provides that Schedule I controlled substances include any material, compound, mixture or preparation that contains any quantity of the following hallucinogenic substances, their salts, isomers and salts of isomers, unless specifically excepted, when the existence of these salts, isomers and salts of isomers is possible within the specific chemical designation. The measure adds specific compounds of fentanyl, PCP, Isopropyl, Phenibut, and N-ethyl hexadrone to the Schedule I list of controlled substances and adds tianeptine to the list of Schedule II substances.

Fiscal Analysis

SB 166, which adds substances to the list of schedule I and II controlled substances, has no significant fiscal or revenue considerations for the state. Adding additional substances can increase the chances an individual can be convicted of being in possession of one, however, this is not significant enough to alter the fiscal impact.
