**Research Analysis**

SB 224 authorizes CLEET to require agency employees and the employees of agency contractors in positions to have access to Oklahoma Peace Officer records, Oklahoma Security Guard and Private Investigator records, Oklahoma Bail Enforcement and Licensing Act records, to be subject to a criminal history search by the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation, as well as be fingerprinted for submission of the fingerprints through the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for a national criminal history check.

**Fiscal Analysis**

SB 224, upon review and with consultation from the Council on Law Enforcement, Education, and Training (CLEET), the measure is determined to have no significant fiscal impact. CLEET estimates there will be an increased cost of \$82/year to the agency for 2 additional employee background checks. The rest of the language is cleanup and clarification: including the authorized redirection of funds between the Peace Officer Revolving (210) Fund and the CLEET Training Center Revolving (215) Fund.
