**Research Analysis**

SB 606 requires owners of unattended food establishments to obtain a permit from the State Department of Health. The measure directs the State Department of Health to create and establish criteria for permits. Unattended food establishments must be located inside a building accessible to a limited population. Unattended food establishments may only offer foods which meet the “packaged and labeled” definition under the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) Food Code, require at most heating or reheating for preparation, and are not sold in bulk. Unattended food establishments must be equipped with refrigeration or freezing units that meet certain conditions. Surfaces must be cleaned in accordance with the FDA food code. Unattended food establishments must provide continuous video surveillance, with recordings available upon request. Permit holders must service the unattended food establishment on a schedule basis. The unattended food establishment must have a visible sign containing the information of the entity responsible for complaints. The measure directs the State Department of Health to establish an annual fee for unattended food establishments not to exceed \$150. Unattended food establishments must obtain an Oklahoma sales tax permit.
