<b>Impact:</b>	<b>CIB: Nonappropriated Agency. Anticipates a negative impact range of \$11,000-\$22,000 for software upgrades. Agency currently cannot estimate loss of revenue to agency for license fee change.</b>

**Research Analysis**

SB 733 removes a requirement in the Oklahoma Inspectors Act that a building and construction inspector be employed by a political subdivision. The bill further provides that an authorized provider may be recognized by a political subdivision to perform the work of a building and construction inspector, and removes a requirement that the provider be under contract with the subdivision. The measure also reduces the time period of a provisional license from 2 years to 1 year.

**Fiscal Analysis**

The Construction Industries Board (CIB), a nonappropriated agency, anticipates software updates for new required language will have a one-time negative impact ranging between \$11,000 and \$22,000. Additionally, the CBI notes the current fee set by administrative rule is \$35 for an individual license; the new language also allows those with multiple licenses to pay a total of \$35. CBI reports that the negative fiscal impact software costs are not likely to be offset by new license fee language. Agency is currently unable to estimate loss of revenue to agency due to license fee cost change.
